

to get to feeling better; pray for the health of Elizabeth West and Clyde & Debbie Caver; pray for our congregation that God will lead us to the right person for our minister.



F.Y.I HEALTHSPOT...

It's Too Hot To Sleep

We have not encountered too much of this vet this summer-but

you know it is coming!

We complain when it is so hot forgetting all the January nights we wished



for a warm summer evening.

Our body needs to be at about 65°F for us to sleep well. The body's core temperature naturally fluctuates during the day and night and again when rising. We need a cool room to sleep well and just a one-degree-Celsius increase in room temperature can mean three fewer minutes of sleep.

If air conditioning your bedroom is not for you try these ideas:

- 1) Trick your body by taking a hot shower or bath an hour or so before bed. This can lower your core temperature.
- 2) Keep your bedroom dark during the day and stay out of it.
- 3) Using a fan is good to provide a cool breeze as well as 'white noise' to help you drift off.
- 4) Buy sheets and pajamas in breathable fabrics like cotton or linen.
- 5) When desperate cool off in front of your freezer for a moment then use ice packs to cool your body and ease discomfort.
- 6) Bedtime routines are important too. Follow a relaxing bedtime routine and avoid bright lights shortly before bed. Then make sure to see sunlight in the morning to regulate our sleep-wake cycle.
