I KNOW THE WAY HOME

© by pam thornton ave you ever been lost? I mean really lost. Like 'I-don't-see-anything-I-recognize lost'? I have. It is a terrible, terrible feeling! These days with cell

ble, terrible feeling! These days with cell phones and GPS it is less likely that we will get lost on the way to somewhere, but it can still happen.

I got lost in Shaker Heights once years ago. Stop laughing. None of Shaker's streets are straight except for a couple, and I wasn't that familiar with Shaker back then. I got lost driving back from Texas once (driving alone) because I got off the highway for some reason. Mom and I got lost trying to get out of San Antonio one time. We stopped, actually, a couple of times to ask for directions. I got lost in China once—had to phone Anna (who was living there then) to help me out. scary. Granted, I am not known in my family for having a stellar sense of direction; however, one thing I am sure of is: I know the way home.

Oh, I don't mean our house on Demington Drive. I mean home to *my real home*. Home in heaven with God!

When we finally find the path we are so happy and confident strolling along, and then the devil throws in the death of a parent. Wait, now I'm confused, because I have had my eyes closed crying—where was I going? Is this the way? Then God gives us the Bible to

Keeping Up With COVID-19 Vaccines

In a 13-1 vote, the CDC's panel of vaccine experts decided that near-universal vaccination for everyone six months or older would provide the best protection against another serious surge in infections this fall and winter. Hospitalizations due to COVID-19 have been increasing since mid-July, CDC scientists reported, and while most of those have involved young children and older people, half of the children under five who have been hospitalized did not have underlying health conditions, a reminder that even otherwise healthy people can experience serious COVID-19 illness.

Some members questioned whether the updated vaccine should be recommended for most people, or just for those at highest risk of COVID-19 complications, such as the very young, the elderly, and those with compromised immune systems. Dr. Matt Daley, senior investigator at the Institute for Health Research at Kaiser Permanente Colorado said that when the group began discussions earlier this summer they did not assume that the updated vaccine would be recommended for everyone. "We viewed this as an opportunity to re-evaluate the vaccination program, and started from a blank slate," he said. The work group therefore asked the CDC for more detailed data on who was being hospitalized, who was experiencing more severe disease, and who was dying from COVID-19, so it could better understand if certain populations were more vulnerable to complications and could benefit from vaccination. What they saw was that "Disease burden does vary greatly by age, but serious illness occurred across all age groups including among those without underlying medical conditions," Daley said. "That was the most persuasive argument for me for universal vaccination."

The updated vaccine will be the first COVID-19 shot to be distributed in the way most vaccines have in the past, prior to the pandemic, on the commercial market for around \$120-\$130 per dose, rather than purchased and provided for by the government. That means that pharmacies and doctors' offices will purchase the vaccines at their own cost and get reimbursed for the shots. Most insurers, including Medicare and private companies, will continue to cover the vaccine, without co-pays, since it is recommended by the CDC.




Recipe···

Taco Soup

1 pound ground sirloin or ground beef

- 1 15 oz can black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 15 oz can pinto beans
- 1 15 oz can Great Northern Beans
- 1 10 oz can Rotel Tomatoes
- 1 15 oz can diced tomatoes
- 1 15 oz can tomato sauce
- 1 11 oz can shoe-pegged corn
- 1 15 oz can beef broth
- 1 pkg. (2 TBSP) taco seasoning



Brown the ground beef or sirloin in a large pot, chopping it into chunks as it browns. Drain all the grease from the meat. Drain and rinse black beans well. Add to pot. Open and add the next nine ingredients into the pot. DO NOT drain anything except the black beans. Stir to combine. Gently heat but do not bring to boil. To serve, place tortilla chips or Fritos in bottom of each bowl. Ladle the soup over the chips and top with sour cream and shredded cheddar cheese, if desired.

**Note: this soup is very good the next day. Putting chips on bottom of bowl may make them too soggy—I put them on top.
