his is supposed to be the "happiest time of the year." We do everything we can to promote that phrase. We wish each other a Merry Christmas

and a Happy New Year. We hear songs about sleigh rides in the snow. We sing about firesides and Christmas bells. We decorate our houses so that every place you look it is festive and bright with twinkling lights and candles and greenery. Our Christmas trees are amazing. They shine through front windows and seem to add a wonderful holiday feel to all who pass by and notice.

But what if you are not. What if it isn't.

Granted, most of my Christmases have been great, and I am not complaining. But I could recount for you several times when it was not the happiest season of the year.

I am not complaining because I am discovering that God was there with me during those "sad" Christmases trying to reach me with a message. I am old enough now to legitimately look back on my life, and it has become so clear to me the different times I was so dull that I did not hear or see God moving in my life.

But he did anyway; even though I was unaware. Do we think he doesn't know that

our hearts are broken or that we are lonely or that we are afraid or ill? I believe he is more acutely aware of our situations than we could ever know.

and the lights were out.

Once in a while we actually have snow on Christmas Eve and God knows that since I grew up in a snowless place I love snow falls. I finished my tasks around the tree and glanced outside. The snow fall was so lovely! Really picture perfect. Then I noticed that the whole world outside had a 'blue' hue to it precisely like you see in a snow scene by Currier & Ives or a Disney movie. It really looked just like that, and I was knocked breathless. I could not believe it was real. I knew immediately that God had given me that extraordinary moment to calm me down and cheer me.

Here's a hug, he said. Here's something truly beautiful you won't see too often in your life, he said. I love you, he said. Stop overthinking. It's going to be all right I've got you, he said.

None of has a right to feel unhappy at this time of year when we are remembering that we celebrate the one gift above all others that has changed our lives forever and always. Jesus! HOW DID ELVES GET TO

BE A 'THING' AT

CHRISTMAS? Ancient

Norse mythology has long had a tradition of

'hidden folk' or as we might call them—elves. Germany, Ireland, Iceland, and many other Celtic cultures had myths of fairies who demanded respect of the natural world but were sometimes evil and full of tricks. In 1823 the poem *The Night Before Christmas* was published and referred

to Santa as "a jolly old elf." By 1857 the idea had caught on and Harpers Weekly published *The Wonders of Santa Claus* which tells how Santa "keeps a great many elves at work/working with all their might/to make a million of pretty things." In 1922, Norman Rockwell released a painting of an exhausted Santa surrounded by tiny, industrious elves trying to finish making toys by Christmas. In the most recent iteration the 'Elf on the Shelf' who serves as Santa's 'informant' seems to have resurrected the slightly creepy nature of the elf tradition.

As recent as 2007 approximately 37% of Icelanders said it was 'possible' that elves still roamed the countryside. 17% said elves were 'probable' and 8% are certain elves are still afoot,

Whether real or fanciful elves make up another fun tradition around the story of Santa Claus.

IT'S ALL A MYTH

If you had to say when are the most suicides during the year perhaps, like me, you would say the Christmas holidays. You would be wrong. According to a survey done in 2021 by the Annenberg Public Policy Center (APPC) the highest rate of suicides was the month of August.

The APPC's analysis from the 2021-22 holiday season newspaper stories discussing the holiday season found that little more than half of the stories supported the false myth while the remainder debunked it.

However, closer study proved the undying holiday-suicide a myth.

3 cups sugar


2/3 cup Hershey cocoa
